As parents, we recognize the value in committing our time and talents to a dedicated community of Trail Life families. Upon registration with Troop KS-1199, we agree to the following:

- We will attend either a Parent Information meeting or Troop Open House in order to more fully understand the mission and programming of TLUSA.
- We understand our son's experience in TLUSA will be enhanced by attendance at a majority of Troop activities which are intentionally designed to be a blend of meetings and Hit the Trail activities, each of which is essential to the learning process.
- Troop leaders are facilitators of the program with support and encouragement from parents who are the primary teachers of their children.
- We will instruct our son to abide by the rules of the Troop and the direction of Troop leaders during all TLUSA meetings and functions.

As a TLUSA Trailman, Navigator or Adventurer, it is a privilege to participate and enjoy Troop meetings and functions. Each youth commits to following the TLUSA oath, and to live by the Trail Life motto to "Walk Worthy".

- I will be respectful to adults at TLUSA meetings and events.
- I will cheerfully obey instructions from Troop leaders.
- I will do all I can to be on time, or better, early to meetings.
- I will be positive and remember "I can do it" or "I will try".
- I will work with other participants together as a team.
- I will do my best to support, encourage, and respect my fellow TLUSA members.
- I will practice patience and wait my turn.
- I will listen when others are talking and not interrupt.
- I will use good manners, e.g., "Please" and "Thank You".
- I will be respectful to others in the way I act physically and verbally.
- I will let a TLUSA leader or parent know if I see something that violates the conduct policy, or anything that makes me uncomfortable.
- I will always be honest.

Since it is our mission to guide our sons to honor God, we recognize that youth will make mistakes, and that accountability must be accompanied by a spirit of forgiveness. Troop leaders will rely on positive reinforcement to address conduct issues, however in cases of severe infractions or persistent behavioral issues the Chartering Organization and Troop reserves the right to dismiss youth from the Troop.
